Incident Narrative

On the above date and time, I met with Ms. Helen M. Stines (see above) after she visited the station relative to a burglary complaint she wished to file. During the visit, Ms. Stines reported that her residence (see above) was entered some time before 04/04/2014, and that a number of items (see below for list) were removed from the home. Ms. Stines then reported that some of the items (see below) were returned to her residence, shortly after the offense, and that the same items were left outside of the home in a white colored, cardboard box. Moreover, Ms. Stines reported that her home was recently sold to her brother (David Heinzl ((419) 734-2882)), but that the burglary and theft took place before the real estate transfer took effect. Ms. Stines then reported that the home was listed by local ReMax real estate agent Jenine Porter (see above) during the sale, and that Ms. Porter may have inadvertently given a male subject (unknown at this time) permission to enter the property and remove items from it. Furthermore, Ms. Stines reported that the subject involved was actually photographed (see attached) leaving the rear portion of her home while holding a white colored, box and black colored, case. Ms. Stines then reported that her son's (Clay Stines ((419) 341-4610)) girlfriend, Ms. Tabitha Loroff ((419) 603-8307), was responsible for taking the photographs involved from her residence which is directly across the roadway from Helen's. Furthermore, Ms. Stines reported that Ms. Loroff also told her that shortly before the photographs were taken, she reportedly observed the same subject, who was described only as an "older gentleman", through an attic window holding a flashlight. When asked, Ms. Stines reported that Tabitha informed her that she could identify the subject involved in a photo line-up if and when the subject is ultimately identified. After receiving the above information, I informed Ms. Stines that I was going to attempt to contact Ms. Loroff so I could obtain a statement from her relative to the offense. Nothing further.

Narrative: On the above date and time, I received a call on my departmental issued cellular telephone from Ms. Tabitha Loroff ((419) 603-8307) regarding the above investigation. During the call, Ms. Loroff reported that she would provide me with a statement, but that she did not witness the incident as reported. Moreover, Ms. Loroff reported that the only information she had regarding the offense was provided to her by Ms. Helen Stines (see above). Ms. Loroff, when asked, also reported that her boyfriend, Mr. Clay Stines, did not witness the incident as well, and that he otherwise did not "want to get involved". From here, Ms. Loroff identified the subject who took the property from the location [REDACTED] before reporting that the same subject already returned the items [REDACTED] took from the home which is now owned by and being maintained by Ms. Stines' Brother. Furthermore, Ms. Loroff reported that she did not take the photographs of the same subject, as previously reported by Ms. Stines, and that Ms. Stines' Brother was actually responsible for taking them and forwarding each photograph to her. After receiving the above information from Ms. Loroff, I informed her that I was going to speak with Ms. Stines further regarding the investigation, and that her assistance was no longer needed.
