On the above date and time, I met with Ms. Helen M. Stines (see above) after she visited the station relative to a burglary complaint she wished to file. During the visit, Ms. Stines reported that her residence (see above) was entered some time before 04/04/2014, and that a number of items (see below for list) were removed from the home. Ms. Stines then reported that some of the items (see below) were returned to her residence, shortly after the offense, and that the same items were left outside of the home in a white colored, cardboard box. Moreover, Ms. Stines reported that her home was recently sold to her brother (David Heinzl ((419) 734-2882)), but that the burglary and theft took place before the real estate transfer took effect. Ms. Stines then reported that the home was listed by local ReMax real estate agent Jenine Porter (see above) during the sale, and that Ms. Porter may have inadvertently given a male subject (unknown at this time) permission to enter the property and remove items from it. and remove items from it. Furthermore, Ms. Stines reported that the subject involved was actually photographed (see attached) leaving the rear portlon of her home while holding a white colored, box and black colored, case.
